Care & Maintenance for GoHaus Vinyl Flooring

Congratulations on your new floors! Your vinyl floors are specifically designed to handle the rigors of everyday use, and require very little maintenance. The following instructions, if followed on a regular basis, will prolong the life of your floors and keep them looking their best.

Do:

- Regularly sweep and vacuum your floors. Dust acts as an abrasive. Keeping your floors dust-free will prolong the life of your finish and wear-layer.
- Wipe up spills as soon as possible. Although your vinyl floors can handle moisture, wiping spills before they dry will make stains much easier to clean.
- Wash your floor occasionally with a recommended cleaner. GoHaus recommends Bona Pro Series Stone, Tile & Laminate Floor Cleaner, available at www.gohaus.com.
- If the finish on your floor starts to dull, you can use Bona Pro Series Stone, Tile & Laminate Floor Refresher to provide a clear, low-gloss layer of protection. Occasional use of the refresher will significantly prolong the life of your floor.

Don't:

- Use detergents, abrasive cleaners or “mop and shine” products – they may leave a dull film on your floor.
- Use paste wax or solvent-based polishes.
- Use a beater bar when vacuuming because it can visibly damage the floor surface.
- Use highly abrasive scrubbing tools.

Immediately after installation:

- For glue-down installations, maintain room temperature between 65°F - 85°F immediately after installation. Once the adhesive has fully cured, the floors can handle a range of 55°F to 100°F.
- In order to allow the adhesive sufficient time to cure, allow 5 days before cleaning your floors with a vacuum or mop.

Proactive protection for your floor:

- When moving appliances or heavy furniture, we recommend laying a Masonite panel on your floor for the best protection.
- Use floor protectors on furniture to reduce indentation. As a general rule of thumb, the heavier the item, the wider the floor protector needed.
- Be careful with rolling casters. They can damage the floor. Therefore, we do not recommend them. If you choose to use them, the double wheel type is the best option.
- Place a walk-off mat at outside entrances to reduce the amount of dirt brought into your home.
